Literacy

Our key story this term will be 'The Lion Inside' this story is about a small animal who befriends a large animal in the African savannah. The children will explore different sentence types, use of adjectives, adverbs and how to use correct punctuation. The children will then write their own versions of this story using a different large and small animal. We will then write instructions for how to care for African animals.

AM

The children will look carefully at the African masks then using oil pastels they will create observational drawings.

The children will use the internet to check the weather in Kenya, then track this on a weather chart and compare it against the weather in England. We will be finding Africa on a map and learning about the equator. The children will find out about foods that grow in warm climates.

Geography



The children will be continuing to work in their Big Maths groups. We will focus on mental addition of 2 digit numbers and solving open ended problems.

The children use percussion instruments and drums to add beats to African songs.
