UNIFORM


We have a huge amount of second-hand uniform donations. The children have picked several charities to donate to rather than send the uniform to landfill.

Chester Folk Festival

Chester Folk Festival will again be running a series of free music workshops, once a month for two hours on a Sunday afternoon between November and May. The aim is that the students will perform the music they learn in a concert at the Chester Folk Festival. I attended the concert last May at the end of last year's sessions and I was amazed at the progress the students had made. I wasn't at all surprised, however, at how much they enjoyed learning new music together and meeting new friends.

The workshops will be led by Clare 'Fluff' Smith, a very experienced teacher, a great motivator and a superb musician, assisted by some young, experienced musicians.

The sessions will take place at St Mary's Handbridge Centre, Overleigh Road, Handbridge, Chester, CH4 7HL. It's a lovely building, with plenty of parking behind St. Mary's church. Access is via the drive at the side of the church. From there it's a short walk to Duke's Drive for those parents/guardians wanting to stretch their legs while the children are playing music. It's also very near the centre of Chester.

The dates of the Young Folk Sunday Sessions are: 3rd November, 8th December, 12th January, 9th February, 9th March, 6th April, 11th May, followed by a performance at Chester Folk Festival in Kelsall on Monday 26th May 2025. All

sessions run between 2 pm and 4 pm. More details and a booking form are on the Chester Folk Festival web site at https://www.chesterfolk.org.uk/young-folk-sunday-sessions.




